Dear Committee,

It is abundantly clear that Lake Margaret is not on the St. Thomas Police Department regular patrol schedule. Since ownership changed hands there has not been a sighting of paroling officers. If Officers are called to attend to a situation they park on a city street closest to the area of infraction and walk to the sight. Many times, the perpetrators have left the scene before Officers arrive.

Now that the trail is completed and travels completely around the lake the Police are prevented from getting a cruiser to various locations as there are stationary bollards at entry locations to prevent vehicles from accessing the trail.

Since this committee has \$60,000 to spent, it is suggested that you earmark funds to provide an All-Terrain Vehicle for Police use. The ATV can be at the Pinafore Park Office. Police can access this vehicle to quickly get to any location around the lake. The Police could then set up regular patrols of the trails and adjoining lands around the lake.

Under the Council approved and adhered to Lake Margaret Environmental Management Plan, which does not permit Watercraft, Fishing nor Swimming, the Police would now be able to access their own ATV to patrol and enforce the rules as established by City By Law. I am sure the Police Officers would be grateful to the committee for this purchase.

This is a small price to pay to allow our Police Department to protect the lake, enforce the bylaws and provincial laws, keep walkers, joggers and cyclists safe and prevent damage to private and public property.

Additionally, when will the approved signage be installed around the lake to advise No fishing, No Watercraft, No Swimming and desperately needed signs to tell bicyclists to SLOW DOWN!
