NEW BUSINESS (Cont'd)

- 2. Recently the YMCA added a 5th value of inclusivity to their Core Values. With this in mind, their priority is to become more accessible to all. Members were consulted on the prioritization of automated door upgrades within their facility. Jerad Henderson, General Manager of the Family YMCA of St. Thomas-Elgin walked the committee members through the intended prioritizations of both the first and 2nd floor plans. Committee members generally agreed with the doors that were chosen by YMCA staff to be automated. Aside from this, committee members suggested that non-accessible washrooms on the 2nd floor be prioritized to be made accessible. Additional comments were to include an accessible door on staff rooms. And it was suggested that the outside push button to automate the exterior front doors also open the 2nd set of interior doors at the same time to give room and time for a wheelchair to enter through them.
- 3. Ashfaq Hussain (Kash) from the City of London Municipal Accessibility Advisory Committee and leading expert on the AODA regulations discussed his involvement in the promotion of accessibility and the importance of increasing awareness and education. Kash shared that with respect to historical or public places, it was best to take a soft approach through recommendations. He will share the link to the new version of the AODA standards once they are approved. Additionally, he added that as a resource, the Federal government through the Accessible Canada Act has a Directorate which oversees federally regulated businesses such as the CRTC, banks, airlines, transit, etc. He encouraged members to build allies and look for partners in the community that will help promote the advancement of accessibility and create an all-inclusive mindset in others.
