HIGHLIGHTS OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING: JANUARY 9, 2023

2023 CAPITAL & OPERATING BUDGET APPROVAL

The Director of Finance and City Treasurer brought forward a report regarding the 2023 Capital and Operating Budget Approval. This was the second report regarding the draft 2023 Capital and Operating Budget, with the original having been presented at the December 5, 2022 meeting.

The new report detailed that the 2023 Operating Budget requires a levy of \$64,729,464 to be raised. This would be an additional \$2,663,931 from the 2022 levy raised of \$62,065,533 or a 4.29% increase. Taking into account that the 2022 assessment growth will raise an additional \$1,194,513 of levy in 2023, the effective increase will be 2.37%.

Council voted in favour to receive the report as information, adopt the estimated 2023 gross expenditures of \$24,328,469 for Capital and \$142,852,760 for Operating, adopt the estimated 2023 non-tax revenues of \$101,451,765 and tax levy of \$64,729,464 to support these gross expenditures, adopt the current operating and capital estimates (as outlined in the report), and authorizes the Director of Finance and City Treasurer to draft a by-law that sets the 2023 tax rates based upon a levy of \$64,729,464 and provides for the 2023 property tax policies required by the Ministry of Finance.
